

- Rotarian, Principal of Charles Campbell College and Chairman Kevin O'Neil spoke on the establishment of the Earlyact Club at the school and introduced some of the members. President Stephany, Rotarians and Guests:





At the end of 2020, the Rotary Club of Campbelltown sponsored and helped establish the Interact Club of Charles Campbell College. Interact Clubs involve members between the ages of 14 and 18 – our secondary students.

At the same time, through Nikki the chair of our club's Youth Committee, we supported Charles Campbell College to establish an EarlyAct Club for students in the primary years, up to the age of 13. The mission of EarlyAct is to promote goodwill, understanding and peace through student service - so that with the committed citizenship and effective leadership they can improve the quality of life of their school, local and global communities.

At a young age, students can easily be encouraged to be caring and helpful. Young people are open to recognise the dignity and worth of each individual, thereby building their respect for others. Earlyacters engage in character building activities that prepare them for leadership roles - they carry out projects which benefit others. In addition to supporting their school's Breakfast Club, the EarlyAct Club has initiated a Backpack Project, and they are here tonight to share their work with you.

For tonight's meeting, we have invited Christine Falco and three members of the Board of Charles Campbell College's EarlyAct Club:

- President Lily
- Vice President Tahlia, and
 - Treasurer Ruby

* Our primary age students raised over \$1,000 for their project and our EarlyAct Club was pleased to receive a donation from the Rotary Club of Campbelltown for an additional \$500 toward the project.

The Earlyact Club members then spoke

Good evening Rotary Club members.

My name is Lily Cartwright, and I am the president of Early Act.

My name is Ruby Cartwright, and I am the treasurer of Early Act.

Tahlia Goodfellow our vice president is an apology.

This year the Early Act members and board members are undertaking a project; backpacks for people experiencing homelessness.

Did you know that a large portion of people experiencing homelessness are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islanders, or females aged over 55 who have had relationship breakdowns or experienced domestic violence? On Friday the 4th of June, Earlyact met with Craig McGlone from Baptist Care who will be supporting us in delivering the backpacks for people in need. In our meeting we showed Craig our list and discussed what items we should and should not include.

We have asked the school and wider community for donations – and have generously been provided with an abundance of items from Lyelll McEwin Hospital,

Ecolateral goods, Campbelltown Council, families and staff.

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EARLYACT PROJECT





So far as a Junior School we have raised over \$1500 which will be used to purchase Food Vouchers and Metro Cards for each backpack. In total we are aiming to make 20 backpacks; 10 for middle aged men and 10 for women aged over 50. We look forward to the opportunity to make a difference for the people experiencing homelessness. We thank you for inviting us here tonight and for your ongoing support.

• Jane Gascoigne then spoke on Rotary Information regarding Rotary Health .

Australian Rotary Health has a broad vision to improve the health and wellbeing of all Australians.

Australian Rotary Health provides funding into a broad range of general health areas, including the Indigenous Health Scholarship Program, which is what I would like to talk to you about tonight.

Indigenous Health Scholarship Program is a cooperative project between Rotary and governments in Australia.

- The project provides a scholarship of \$5,000 per year to assist Indigenous students in healthrelated professions – \$2,500 from Rotary with matching \$ from Government. (State or Federal)
- over 25% of all graduated Indigenous Doctors have received scholarships through the Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Health Scholarship Program

The program commenced in 1999, initiated by Geoff Bailey OAM, a member of the Rotary Club of Mitcham. Geoff had worked around indigenous people as a pharmacist in Pt Augusta and was acutely aware that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders do not access or benefit from mainstream health services to the same extent as other Australians:

- Health services are not accessible to many, particularly in remote Aboriginal communities.
- Mainstream health services often lack cultural sensitivity and remain unwelcoming places for many Indigenous peoples. The Indigenous health workforce remains disproportionately low when compared to the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders that make up the Australian population.
- Aboriginal people have higher rates of ill health than any other group in Australia.

Having more Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health professionals working in health service delivery, provides for more culturally appropriate health care.

The program started with 2 students. Geoff then started recruiting other clubs to support the program. In 2001, there were 7 scholarships by 2002 it doubled to 14 scholarships.

At Geoff's instigation administration was taken over by Rotary Health in 2003. This helped spread the program Australia-wide.

The Rotary Club's commitment is \$2,500 per annum paid to Australian Rotary Health. *Students are paid the scholarship twice a year – after <u>passing</u> subjects Clubs provide mentoring and support to the students.*

I am very proud to be part of a Club who has supported this program over many years.

Our first student was Rebecca Richards who went on to be the first Indigenous Australian to be awarded a Rhodes Scholar. She is now studying for a PHD and tutoring at the University of Adelaide. *See Pic 2 - Rebecca Richards*

• Chair Kevin O'Neil introduced our Guest Speaker Claire Arthur.

Claire is a four-time Australian Senior Trampoline Champion.

Claire is a member of the Australian Trampoline Team which strived to qualify for the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games.

She has represented Australia at over 16 international competitions, making the finals at World Championships and World Cups in the synchronised event.

Claire grew up in the Adelaide Hills with her younger brother and parents. She has been doing gymnastics and aerial sports all her life including artistic gymnastics, diving and trampolining.

Outside of the gymnastics world, Claire is currently studying Physiotherapy in her 4th year.

Claire works as a physiotherapy assistant and coaches at Gymnastics SA and Blackwood Trampoline Sports.


Claire works with the Australian Olympic Committee as an ambassador bringing the Olympic Unleashed Program to primary schools. This program inspires students to find and unleash their passion.

In her spare time, Claire loves to travel - her favourite country is Italy where

her family is from. Claire returned from Italy only last month following the final Olympic qualification event.


She loves to cook, hike, go to the beach and hang out with her friends and family. I'd like Claire to come forward and share her experiences with you.

• Claire began by saying she can just remember watching her 1st Sydney 2000 Olympics as a young child and she realised

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then that it was such a big deal and was so exciting. So began her dream and passion to strive for the Olympics.

Claire also shared an amazing video of her trampoline 2019 World Championship held in Tokyo. See Link Here

Each trampolinist does a compulsory routine and a voluntary routine. Judges score based on difficulty, execution, time of flight and horizontal displacement.

Claire trains 12x a week and fits that in with study and work. A typical day is 5:30am training, then to Uni, then to work followed by training in afternoon followed by recovery. She unfortunately did not manage to qualify for the 2021 Tokyo Olympics. She is proud that she had a go and put in a 100% effort.

Everyone should find what they enjoy doing and to make your goals around that.

In conclusion Kevin thanked Claire for sharing her ups & downs 😉 and having a good message for us all.

If paying by Bank Transfer – Please add your Name etc "Joe Citizen-Subs" or similar so the Treasurer knows who has made the payment & for what.






