 PP Benny is an apology tonight and has left a message that the Shed is hoping to hold a furniture sale in two weeks and a general sale on the last Saturday of August.


Secretary Susan Harris made the following announcements








Recipe Corner-From "An Apple a Day"

-A SACWA Members Recipes Cookbook -Cost \$12

Apple Scones (Uses Laucke CWA Specialty Scone Mix)

Ingredients

500 gm Laucke CWA specialty Scone Mix 4 Granny Smith Apples 150gm sugar

100ml extra water 250 ml cold water 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg or cinnamon



Method

Peel, core and chop 2 of the apples finely. Put scone mix into bowl add apples and half the sugar and combine. Stir in the water using a straight bladed knife. Turn out onto a floured board, sprinkle with flour and knead until smooth and not sticky. Roll out and cut into rounds.

Bake 15mins 210 °C. Peel, core and slice thinly the remaining apples.

Put apples into a saucepan with the remaining sugar, the nutmeg or cinnamon and extra water. Simmer apples until tender (about 10 mins). Drain .Serve the scones with poached apple slices and thick cream.





