A copy of Stephany's Presidential speech is provided below: -

My journey to this office within the club has been not without its challenges -- and I am not even talking about Covid.

Recalling where I was when I joined this club just under ten years ago from the Rotary Club of Wentworth, I was catching three buses to and from Rotary, studying and working - while balancing Rotary at the age of 18. Now having achieved one of my career goals in becoming a qualified lawyer, and now serving the club as president, at age 28.

I am told I am the youngest President to lead our club in its now 55-year history, taking this mantle from our charter president, Past President, the late Richard Fereday, who presided in a very different environment to which we are here today.

I hope I have shown through my actions over the past 10 years, that I am a Rotarian of good standing. Someone that all can be proud to be leading our club through the next year. A year when we are the home of the District Governor, which I, and I am sure many here, are incredibly proud of.

This club has seen me grow and I would like to think that while that was happening, the club has also grown with me.

Due to the changing border restrictions, at our recent changeover, I was unable to have my family in attendance; however, I was able to have some of my closest friends, and, most importantly, I was able to have my Rotary family there. I recognise the importance that family has in our ability to be a part of Rotary. I am keen to see family more involved this Rotary year.

While I may talk about how I will serve as President this year, our club is driven by its members. Rotary is a member-driven organisation, and I see myself simply as a Chair of a Board. Our members have amazing ideas for our service, and I encourage you to put these forward. We need all of your history, your creativity, and your connections to make our club as impactful as possible. As District Governor Jeff Neale has mentioned to me, the President of our Rotary Club is

not like the President of the United States. We are a team and our success over the next year will not be mine alone but ours.

Rotary is not only an organisation to which we belong. We don't say to the public that we are a member of Rotary. When people ask, we name ourselves as a Rotarian. And while this is a minor word change, it is a significant change in how we approach our lives. Being a tennis club member might mean we play a match on a Saturday, and that is where it ends. Whereas being a Rotarian explains that we have an ethos we believe in. A four-way test we are pleased to hold ourselves to. Our example in our workplaces, in our families, in our neighborhoods, and in our businesses are where Rotary is at work, through us, as Rotarians.

RI President-elect Shekhar Mehta urges us to become more involved in service projects, saying that caring for and serving others is the best way to live because it changes other people's lives and our own. This is the basis for his theme of Serve to Change Lives.

The beauty of Rotary is that service means something different to every person around the world. One element that we can incorporate into all of our service however is empowering girls. Unfortunately, even in this day and age, girls and young women face disproportionate challenges worldwide. Rotary has the power to lead the charge for gender equality. Empowering girls and young women to have greater access to education, better health care, more employment, and equality in all walks of life should be embedded in every Rotary project we conduct. Girls are both current and future leaders, so we must ensure that we help them shape their future.

But I would ask you to consider the four way test when you are invoiced, in whether it is fair to all concerned if you ask for it to be waived.

I also encourage members that when intending to go to be away to enter that in the book at the front desk. This assists in rostering, and also with meal orders. If you are away for four meetings or longer, please apply for leave of absence to Secretary Frank. This assists you in not having to apologise for non-attendance, but it also assists the club in knowing when you will be away.

In the coming year I look forward to arranging engaging, entertaining, and informative speakers for members to listen to, so that our attendance goes up because members want to attend meetings because they enjoy it, rather than through being required. There may also be meetings during the year where we complete service, which I anticipate will be enjoyable.

I was president in 1969/1970.

My Induction as President of the Rotary Club of Campbelltown was held at the Reservoir Hotel on the 30th June 1969.

What were some highlights of the year?

District Governor Allen Hosking had his official visit early in the year on the 7th of July.

While DG Allen joined our Club Assembly, Shirley Entertained His wife Jean and the Rotarians wives at our home. DG Allen and the Rotarians joined them latter for supper.

During the year Celebrated our 4th Birthday with a Ladies Night

R.I. President James F Conway and his wife Evelyn Visited Adelaide.

Campbelltown Rotarians and Families joined DG Allen along with other Rotarians from D250 greeted the R.I. president at the airport.

The Adelaide Club arranged an intercity meeting at the then Hotel Australia in Honor of RI President Jim and his wife Evelyn. Shirley and I along with several other couples from our club attended.

The next day a BBQ was arranged at Rowland Flat by the Rotary Club of Barossa valley to allow Presidents and their wives to meet informally with R.I. President Jim and Evelyn.

The Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) was introduced to D250 for the first time. The RYLA Seminar was run by Adelaide Rotary Club. We sponsored a student to attend.

This was also the first year that our club participated in Youth Exchange. We sent a young man Paul Hubbard to Brazil. Our incoming student was Jane Springthorpe from South Africa. Jane was hosted by our Club members

One of our major fund raisers was the Auction and Jumble sale - HELD ON THE 18TH October 1969.

There a variety of stalls – Hardware, Fruit and veg, clothing, Books cake stall etc. We then had an auction towards the end of the morning for items we thought we could get a bit more money for.

We also had a Dunking Machine – often Rotarians Dunked in full clothes. In that year we had income of \$1638.00 with a net profit of \$1332.00

Can I interrupt you there? Can you tell me about the car that was donated for Auction?

Someone donated an old car to be Auctioned

As I was driving it to the Sale I was pulled over by the police as the car was unroadworthy. Told him what I was doing and fortunately he let me off.

So what else did the club do?

Reg

We organized a Mardi gras - basically gave an opportunity to Clubs and organisation in the area to set up a stall and raise money. Collectively we were able to raise \$7500.00

We also did a donation of 50 Cups and saucers to the local Mothers and Babies Health Association at a cost of \$33.55.

We donated \$30.00 to the Lincoln Borthwick Kindergarten for a new Heater.

So there was a lot happening What about Membership?

At the end of my year, we had 36 members – 19 of which were charter Members. That means that over our first 4 years we inducted 17 new members so almost double.

Jeff joined the club in 1990 n served as President in 2007 - 2008. He is a Paul Harris Fellow with 3 sapphires.


Jeff is married to Jenny, they have 3 adult children and a new grandson.

• DG Jeff then thanked everyone for their support in his new role and for those who attended the DG changeover last Sunday. He had an apology tonight from his wife Jenny. If it wasn't for covid restrictions stopping his Dad from attending the District Changeover, the Neale's would have not just 3 but 4 generations represented. Jeff said that his Dad Reg and late Mum Shirley were a big influence and gave him such a great advantage in his life. He fondly remembers that Rotary and the Campbelltown members also played a big part his formative years. A special thanks to Peter Rumbelow who found a copy of the 1969 Annual Report that was in his Dad's presidential year and was used earlier. DG Jeff then shared some insights about the structure of District 9510, the many roles within the District,& how a lot of work is done, behind the scenes by dedicated Rotarians, serving District Roles.

He then asked for a show of hands, on who are serving on District Roles within the Club? He then thanked them personally, for the great work they do and that is the reason why, sometimes they are not able to attend Club meetings due to their district commitments. Please give them your support. In the year ahead, Jeff as DG, supported by wife Jenny, plan to meet, each and every 84 Clubs within the District. As there are only 52 weeks in a year his Dinner Diary is booked out for at least 2-3 nights a week till March 2022. He is assisted in this role with the feedback of the Area Coordinators (12) and his executive team.

Other matters and areas of focus discussed were: -

- Polio is still a top priority but not the only thing; Yes, clubs to be encouraged to support projects locally and globally and everything in-between.
- Clubs to look at your members- Are you engaging them? Do they feel welcome? Projects bring people in, but relationships keep
- The district is there to offer, assistance and guidance to the Clubs and provide the administrative framework to make it happen.
- The District Area Coordinators will encourage individual Clubs to personally interact & connect with other Clubs, for efficiency of resources, and greater outcomes.
- Encourage Club Members to talk to friends and share with them what Rotary is about. Be prepared to answer questions, have a few stories you can share, tell them of What you have done & Why etc. Remember what motivated you to join Rotary, may inspire/motivate others. Just plant the seed & share your Rotary Journey.
- What about our Club in the year ahead?
 - We are lucky & a privileged club with a good member base, but we need to not be complacent.
 - o For our April 2022 district conference everyone is important and is recognised for the work they can do, in any way to make it a success. So please support the Conference Committee if you asked to help. Thanks to everyone who has accepted roles so far & thanks to all those on the committee chaired by Susan Harris.


