

Guest Speaker



Dr Tim Lathlean is Adelaide born and bred- growing up in the greater Unley area. He completed his PhD at Monash University in Melbourne and has recently returned from Armidale, NSW where he worked as a Lecturer at the University of New England. Clinically, Tim is an Accredited Exercise Physiologist (AEP) and Accredited Exercise Scientist (AES), helping patients prevent and manage chronic disease as well as helping to identify, prevent and manage injury. Tim has supervised over 16 students in the applied sports science/injury setting as well as 7 Masters' students from four different Universities across primary health care and community health care settings. While working at a Grade 3 AEP in community health in Victoria, Tim managed a team of staff including physiotherapists, allied health assistants and AEPs. For his research endeavours, Tim's PhD focused on the epidemiology of sports injury in elite junior team sport, where he carried out a prospective study with 562 football players across 9 clubs. T



sport, where he carried out a prospective study with 562 football players across 9 clubs. This work has led to a number of presentations at national (SMA, ESSA) and international (IOC, Aspire) conferences and 6 research publications. Tim maintains his research and clinical interests actively supervising students in the


university sector. For leisure, Tim enjoys hiking around Adelaide with his young family as well personal fitness and team sports.

Tim is married to Tanya. They have a 23-month-old son William and a little brother not far away. Tim is my neighbour in Rostrevor.

Tim then gave his presentation on Exercise Management for Chronic Conditions.

WHAT IS AN ACCREDITED EXERCISE PHYSIOLOGIST?

- Accredited by peak body Exercise and Sports Science Australia*
- •Member of National Alliance of Self-Regulating Health Professions^
- •Prevention and management of injury and/or illness
- •Involved in "sub-acute" care
- •Work as part of broader multi-disciplinary team

People affected from any of the Chronic conditions (see right) can benefit both mentally and physically from following a managed exercise program tailored for there condition. DR Tim discussed some of the above in more detail and discussed that research showed the benefits of

exercise in both prevention and chronic condition management.

Some of the questions asked following his presentation were:-



What is the recommended type of exercise for the average person?

As a general rule 150-300 minutes of exercise /per week (20-40mins /day). Better some exercise than none; mixing the intensity of exercise workouts is beneficial; doing resistance strength training 2-3 x/week is also good.

Exercise as a prevention to Chronic Disease?

Research shows that exercise is beneficial mentally and physically and can reduce and mediate risk in the prevention of chronic disease.

What about Post-Polio Syndrome?

This is a neurological condition and though you may believe this affects only older people there is a case in Melbourne recently of a SriLankan girl who was only 25 yo. An exercise program needs to be tailored to each individual case to suit their condition and ability.






